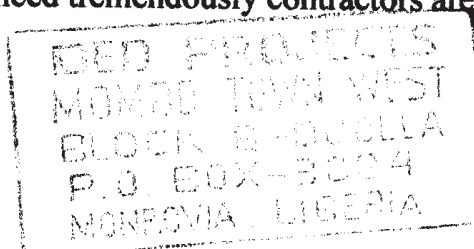
It is encouraging to see the fostering of academic competition. We wish all the best to see our goal is to continue make them productive.

5. Aunty Janice and uncle Herbent cousins USA donated clothing shoes under wears Cosmetics to orphanage.

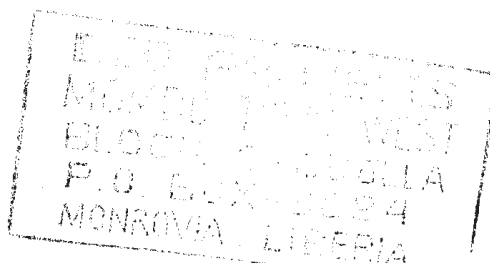
Entire seasoning was wonderful.
